The Story of the Advent Wreath

Advent wreaths were originally part of folk traditions of Northern Europe. Wreaths of evergreens were decorated with candles to symbolize life and light during the dark months of winter. Legend has it that Saint Boniface first gave the wreath its Christian meaning in the eighth century, and we have been using these wreaths as part of our Advent preparation ever since.

The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God. The evergreens signify continuous life. Each of the four candles represents one of the Sundays of Advent. The purple candles represent the prayer, penance, preparation, and good works we are called to do during Advent. The color purple signifies the "royalty" of Jesus Christ.

The pink candle is lit on the Third Sunday of Advent, which is the Sunday of rejoicing. The light of the candles reminds us that Jesus comes into the darkness of our lives to bring newness, life, and hope. We gradually add more light each Sunday until Christ, our Light, comes at Christmas.

Principal's Message:

On Sunday November 27th, we began the season of Advent. Advent is a very important time in our faith as we begin a new liturgical year and prepare for the coming of Jesus. The Advent wreath is a symbol of our waiting. As each week passes, we light another candle as we prepare our hearts for the birth of Jesus. A deliberate observance of Advent prepares us for a richer experience of Christmas.

Our board theme this year focuses on the importance of family – those closest to us, and our connections to one another as sisters and brothers of one God. Just as we each have a family tree, Jesus had a family tree too, and the Advent tradition of the "The Jesse Tree" tells the story of his family members.

On behalf of the staff of St. Bernard's Catholic School, I would like to wish you all an Advent season full of hope, joy and peace. For those of you who are traveling over the holidays, may God bless your travels and return you home safely.

Let as go rejoieing to the house of the Lord.

Bullying Prevention Week at SBE November 20 - 26, 2016:

The SMCDSB theme for Bullying Prevention Week was Be Kind Online -What is Your Digital Footprint? Staff encouraged students to use this year's theme to reflect on social media etiquette and the importance of kindness and the respect of others, and to think before they text, share, or post anything online. We must expand our focus beyond the traditional view of children as the bullied, the bully, and the bystander to include the relationship of children, including online social interactions.

By combining the individual needs of the child with what we know about social dynamics of children's peer groups, and the role that adults play in shaping children's experiences, we gain a deeper understanding of the complexities of bullying and recognize multiple approaches required to prevent and stop bullying.

Dismissal and Crosswalk Safety Reminders:

For the safety and security of our students and staff, the Kiss and Ride will be closed at the end of the school day. Cars will not be permitted to enter the Kiss and Ride area or the school parking lot to pick up students. If you are driving to pick up your child after school, you must park your car on a side street and walk on to the school property. Please do not park on Oxford Street in front of the school as per the by-law signs. Traffic becomes backed up and this can cause unnecessary congestion, which makes it more difficult for our busses to leave in a timely and safe manner. To ensure further the safety of all, please use the crosswalk and sidewalks when escorting your child from school. Vehicles in the school parking lot will not be allowed to exit until 3:30 pm. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping everyone safe.

Dressing For Winter & Inclement Weather:



Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather conditions throughout the day. Hat, mitts or gloves, snow pants and boots are necessary. Please label all clothing items. Students will be outside for recess during the winter months as weather permits - please always send your child to school dressed for outdoor recess.

We are in the North Weather Zone. In the event that the busses are cancelled, the school is open for drop off at 8:40 am in the main foyer and students must be picked up at dismissal at 3:15 pm. If your child walks, please call the Safe Arrival line to report if they will be absent or late.
