Safe Arrival & Attendance

It is important that your child arrives at school safely and on time. Not only does it make things easier for our office administrator and classroom teachers, it also teaches your child the value of being punctual. Our Safe Arrival Program, which includes communicating with our office when your child is late or absent, helps ensure student safety.

Please follow this simple, but critical process when reporting your child as late or absent.

- **Step 1** Phone our school at (705)326-2331 prior to the start of the school day on the day your child is going to be absent or late. There is a answering machine 24 hours per day.
- **Step 2 –** Leave your child's full name, classroom teacher's name and the reason for the absence on the school answering machine.
- **Step 3** If your child is late, please bring him/her to the office to sign in and obtain a late slip for admittance to class.

School Agendas

Our staff is committed to helping students with time management, organizational and communication skills. For this reason, students from Kindergarten to Grade 8 are required to have a school agenda. The cost of the agenda is \$5.00. Please submit this fee to your son/daughter's classroom teacher by the end of September.

We hope you will find this student agenda helpful. There is a wealth of information related to how our school operates on a day-to-day basis. This agenda also contains useful information from our board office. By taking the time to familiarize yourself with our expectations, you can help us maintain a positive learning experience for all students and staff.

Allergies



St. Bernard's is an allergen aware school. If your child has a severe allergy, it is absolutely critical that you let us know. With your help, we will do our best to reduce risk and make sure all our students are safe, healthy, and able to concentrate on learning.

We have students who have life-threatening peanut and tree-nut allergies. We require that all students' lunches and snacks be nut-free.

Our staff has been instructed on how to deal with anaphylactic shock. However, our best course of action is to prevent exposure to potentially life-threatening allergies. As a school community, we must work together to ensure the safety of our students.

Here is what we are doing to reduce the risk of allergic exposure:

- All food and beverages must be consumed inside the classroom – under no circumstances are students allowed to have snacks in the schoolyard.
- Your child's classroom teacher will inform you if there are

severe and/or other allergies in your child's classroom. We ask that you please understand and appreciate the health and safety of every student by not sending food and beverage items that may be a cause for concern.

- Please check with your child's classroom teacher before providing treats for the classroom for special occasions. There are many students with a variety of food allergies and so we err on the side of caution to make sure all of our students are safe.

Medication



If your child requires any medication to be administered at school, a medication form must be completed and returned to the office. In addition, a new form must be completed each school year.

Medication must be brought to the office by a parent/ guardian. Please do not send medication with your son/ daughter. Medication must be given to the school in its original container. All medication must be kept in the office and dispensed from the office.

Daily Procedures:

Students who are leaving school early must bring a note to their classroom teacher at the start of the school day stating the need for the early dismissal. All requests must be submitted in writing by the parent/guardian to the school office prior to the change. Please avoid phoning in any last minute changes in dismissal routine.

Morning Drop-off & Afternoon Pick-up

Once again this year, our Kiss and Ride will only be available for student drop-off in the morning.

For the safety and security of our students and staff, the Kiss and Ride will be closed at the end of the school day. Cars will not be permitted to enter the Kiss and Ride area or the school parking lot to pick up students. If you are driving to pick up your child after school, you must park your car on a side street and walk on to the school property. Please do not park on Oxford Street in front of the school as per the by-law signs. Traffic becomes backed up and this can cause unnecessary congestion, which makes it more difficult for our busses to leave in a timely and safe manner. To ensure further the safety of all, please use the sidewalks when escorting your child from school. Parents/Guardians/Visitors with accessibility needs are reminded to please have their permit displayed on their vehicle when using accessible parking spaces. Vehicles in the school parking lot will not be allowed to exit until 3:30 pm. Thank you for your cooperation.

Riding the Bus


We would like to support the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC) in providing safe and reliable bus transportation for our students who are bussed. It is helpful to periodically remind your child about the rules and regulations of riding a school bus. Here are some basic guidelines to follow:

- Your child must always enter the bus in an orderly manner and immediately find his/her seat. Once on the bus, he/she must always follow the instructions of the school bus driver.
- All students must remain in their seats while the bus is in motion. With children sitting quietly, the bus driver is free from distractions and able to focus on road safety.
- Students must also refrain from eating or drinking on the bus.
- Heads and arms must stay inside the bus at all times and aisles should be kept clear.

Occasionally, we receive requests from parents to allow their child to ride the bus in order to visit a friend's house. Unfortunately, we are unable to accommodate these requests.

Lunch Programs

St. Bernard's will continue to run pizza, pita and milk programs. Milk is being sold daily. The lunch programs will start up in the week of September 26. Food order forms will be sent home the second week of school.



Volunteering at SBE

We are always looking for volunteers to help enhance our school community. Anyone hoping to volunteer must have a Criminal Background Check (CBC) and Vulnerable Sector Screening done by the OPP. These documents are provided free of charge to volunteers and we have the letter in the front office for you to complete. This process can take up the 8 weeks. Please consider getting the proper documentation in place now so you and your child won't be disappointed later in the year. Contact the office for more information.

Breakfast Program

We will continue with our Breakfast Program to help ensure that every child attends school well nourished and prepared to learn. Health food items such as yogourt, granola bars, juice etc., will be provided to any student who comes to the Breakfast Club. We are hoping to start the program the week of September 12 but we are still short a few volunteers. The time required is about 45 minutes in the morning from 8:10 - 8:55 am. Anyone who is interested in volunteering to assist with our program is asked to contact the office.



"Gotcha" Program

We will once again be using our "Gotcha" program. The purpose of the program is to encourage our students to perform random acts of kindness. Student's who earn a "Gotcha" will be entered into a monthly draw for prizes.
